Find this sculpture. Look at the twisted metal. What shapes do you see? Can you twist your body into silly shapes?




Find this sculpture. Follow the bridge all the way to the end. What do you see? How many trees grow through the floor of the bridge? Look how high up you are!

Find this sculpture. What animals have heads this bia? Do you think this animal had sharp teeth? What do you think it would eat? Pretend to be this creature.



Find this sculpture. Does this look like a bird? Where is its head? Would this bird flap his wings fast like a hummingbird or slow like an eagle? Pretend you are this bird and flap your wings!



Find a tree you can hug. Where are its roots? Where are its branches? Where are the leaves? Now pretend you are a tree blowing in the wind!

Find this sculpture.

Look at the shadow. Do you see the straight lines? Make your shadow look like a straight line. Now make two straight lines. Can you make three?

Find this sculpture. Watch it move. How many pieces are moving? What color is it? If you could paint it, what color would you choose? Can you move your arms like this sculpture?

Can you find a spiderweb? How about a spider? Can you crawl like a spider?





Find this sculpture. Listen to the water. Look at the tool he uses to scoop the oysters out of the water. These are called tongs. Pretend you are using tongs to scoop oysters out of the water. DO NOT PLAY IN WATER OR CLIMB ON SCULPTURE!
